The guide is non-partisan, and is not intended to endorse or oppose any candidate, either explicitly or implicitly. It simply provides pertinent information about the candidates themselves, and their positions on issues of importance. In some cases, candidates refused to answer our questionnaire, or did not respond despite our several attempts to contact them.

**What's inside:** This guide contains information on candidates seeking the position of U.S. Congressman, with two Special State Senate elections and one State General Assembly race. Included for the races is a photo of each candidate and a listing of their positions to our questionnaire. If you are unable to determine the legislative district in which you live and or need to know where you go to cast your vote please call your County Board of Elections. We have provided the phone numbers for you by county in this voter guide.

**Using the guide:** Please be aware it is perfectly legal for you to bring this guide with you into the voting booth. However we recommend that you fully review the guide first to determine your selection beforehand. Please also consider passing the Voter's Guide


